***Matthew 21:9 — "The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'"***

As I write this, Palm Sunday and Holy Week are upon us. Palm Sunday was a profound indication of change, marking the transition from Jesus's public ministry to his final week of suffering, death, and resurrection. Palm Sunday symbolizes Jesus Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, marking the start of Holy Week. It represents his recognized role as King and Messiah, his humility in riding a donkey rather than a warhorse, and his impending victory over death, while also foreshadowing his passion and crucifixion. However God has promised us over and over about his love and care for us, all of us!

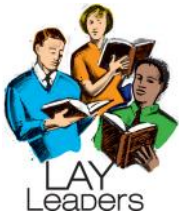

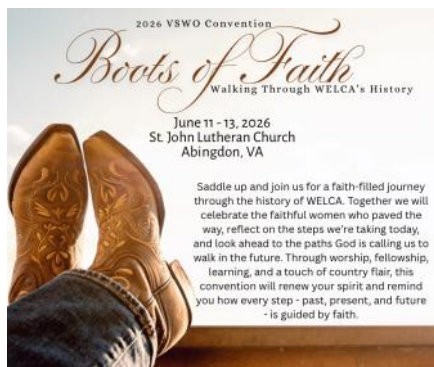

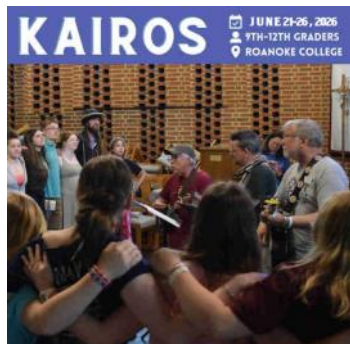

where youth and adults gather together for lots of singing and skits and fun and friend-making and prayers, then participants gather in small groups that meet throughout the week. There are so many beloved features of Kairos: event theme t-shirts, Open Talent Mic Show, faith testimonies, comic relief, reflection time, prayer stations, speed friending, t-shirt fashion show, and more! This

event is a chance for youth who are already committed to a life of faith to be part of a unique Christian community for an entire week, to have a fresh experience of the grace and presence of God in that community, and to develop habits for discipleship that can be taken home as they live out their baptismal call to be followers of Jesus. Unlike our weekend events (Lost & Found, Winter Celebration), congregational adult advisors are not required to accompany youth to this event. ## **General Information** — how all this flows!

(All schools have done this before, there are some new students/teachers. Schools usually arrange for sufficient chaperones.)

When buses arrive, 3Rs' Mike Myers will talk to each bus to remind the students:

- of their budget,
- they're here to pick books they want to read over the summer break,
- that book bags will be held by the school and given to the students at the end of school.

Shopping begins! (we're looking for controlled chaos, not perfection! It's **fun!**)

- students will pick books to put in their book bags provided by Green Valley Book Fair.
- students must stay in the Children's Books building - 1 volunteer stands at the exit to the Adult Books building to ensure our students/chaperones know not to go over there.
- we encourage students to select books to read - no coloring books, games, stuffed animals.
- we do not let students select books from the Social Issues aisle - 2 volunteers stand in that section and divert students to other aisles/areas.
- when students are done, they will exit to the barn area
- 2 volunteers work the pre-checkout tables -- have students empty book bag, estimate/count book purchases to ensure they're within budget ... A little over/under is fine. If way under - tell them to get another book! If way over - ask them to choose which book(s) goes/go back on the shelf (we'll re-shelve later).
- when book bag is checked and good - direct student to take books and bag to appropriate line to checkout.
- students that are done should exit the barn - to outside; they should not go back into the book fair.

There's plenty of time for a lunch break if volunteers work both shifts on a day. Bring a lunch and picnic or go to a nearby place - McDonalds, Buc-ees, Village Inn lunch buffet, Overlook Produce ...

# Health and Wellness News

## Be Prepared For Spring Weather

As we transition into spring, it is important to stay prepared for seasonal weather changes. Spring can bring weather hazards such as thunderstorms, heavy rainfall, flooding, high winds, hail, and even tornadoes.

Please take a moment to review these spring weather safety reminders.

### Preparing for Severe Spring Weather:

- Keep an emergency kit in both your home and in your car (battery powered weather radio, flashlight, blankets, cell phone, batteries, etc.)
- Sign up for local emergency alert notifications. (Most municipalities provide alert notifications which will inform residents in times of crisis.)
- Monitor your local radio or television for current weather conditions and possible severe weather.
- In the event of severe weather know the difference between storm watches and warnings.
  - Watch - A weather watch means there is the potential, or conditions exist for a dangerous weather event.
  - Warning - A weather warning means that a dangerous weather event is imminent. Immediate action must be taken to protect life and property.
  - Advisory - A weather advisory means weather conditions that are less serious than a warning is possible. These events may cause a significant inconvenience, and if caution is not exercised, it could lead to a situation that may be threatening to life and property.

## **When Severe Weather Strikes**

### **Indoors**

- Stay away from windows.
- Use flashlights if the power goes out. Have a battery-powered NOAA weather radio on hand to monitor weather reports.
- Discontinue use of landline phones and electrical equipment.
- Avoid taking a shower or bath. If lightning strikes your house, it may send a current of electricity across metal plumbing throughout the house.

### **Outdoors**

- Stay low. If possible, find shelter in a building.
- Keep away from trees, tall objects, metal objects and water.
- Boaters and swimmers should get to land as soon as possible.

### **While Driving**

- Reduce your speed.
- Pull off to the shoulder of the road. Be sure you're away from tall objects, such as trees, which could fall due to wind or lightning. Do not clog highway underpasses.
- Turn on your emergency flashers and remain in the car until the storm passes.
- Do not touch any metal objects in the car.
- Never attempt to drive on roads covered by water.
- In a vehicle: Being in a vehicle during a tornado is not safe. The best course of action is to drive to the closest shelter. If you are unable to make it to a safe shelter, either get down in your car and cover your head or abandon your car and seek shelter in a low-lying area such as a ditch or ravine.

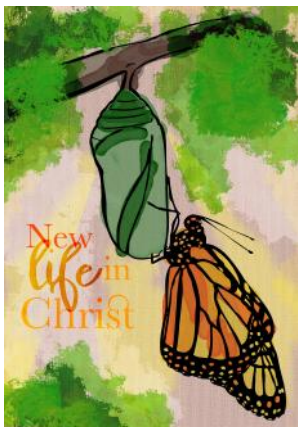
